SF RUDY GAY

- Ranks **11th** in the NBA in scoring (**20.3** points) and ranks in the top 20 for the third time in the last four years.
- Averaging 24.5 points, 7.0 rebounds and 5.0 rebounds on .500 shooting in his last two games, both wins over the two teams that made the 2012 NBA Finals, the Miami Heat and Oklahoma City Thunder.
- Led the Grizzlies in scoring last season (19.0 points) in returning from a season-ending shoulder injury the previous year.
- One of seven NBA players last season to rank in the top 20 in both scoring (17th) and steals (1.46, 16th), joining Monta Ellis, LeBron James, Brandon Jennings, Chris Paul, Josh Smith and Russell Westbrook.
- Helped the United States win the gold medal at the 2010 FIBA World Championships.

- Averaging **17.1** points and an NBA-high **14.1** rebounds this season with **eight** double-doubles following an injury-marred 2011-12 campaign.
- Selected to the 2010-11 All-NBA Third Team after posting 20.1 points and a franchise-record 12.2 rebounds, earning the franchise's first Player of the Month Award in January 2011 and three Western Conference Player of the Week Awards.
- Named to the 2010 NBA All-Star Game, his first career selection and second all-time for the Grizzlies.
- Entered the season having averaged at least 20 points and 10 rebounds in five of his 11 NBA seasons.
- Has **317** double-doubles since the start of the 2003-04 season, **fifth**-most in the NBA.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #8 – MEMPHIS 105, NEW YORK 95, Nov. 16 at FedExForum

Memphis, Tenn. – The Memphis Grizzlies knocked the Knicks from the ranks of the unbeaten and placed themselves atop the NBA standings for the first time in franchise history... With the 10-point win, Memphis recorded double-digit victories over the Miami Heat, the Oklahoma City Thunder and the Knicks in the span of a week and extended their franchise-record regular-season home winning streak to 15 games... **Marc Gasol** led all scorers with 24 points, while **Zach Randolph** notched his eighth double-double with 20 points and 15 rebounds... **Rudy Gay** chipped in 17 points and a season-high four blocks, while **Mike Conley** tallied 16 points and eight assists... After a contentious first half, Memphis exploded on a 19-1 run in the third quarter, capped by a **Tony Allen** and-1 shot at the basket to give the Grizzlies their largest lead of the game (77-56) with 4:59 left in the quarter... New York would get no closer than eight points the rest of the way... Memphis would punish New York in the paint during the third quarter, outscoring the Knicks 15-4 from the foul line and 31-18 total in the third frame... **Carmelo Anthony** scored 20 to lead the Knicks, who were denied tying their franchise-record 7-0 start from the 1993-94 season.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #7 – MEMPHIS 107, OKLAHOMA CITY 97, Nov. 14 at Chesapeake Energy Arena

Memphis, Tenn. – The Memphis Grizzlies stayed red-hot by recording a sixth consecutive victory playing on the road against the defending Western Conference Champion Oklahoma City Thunder... After trailing by 10 at the end of the first quarter (30-20), Memphis used a balanced scoring attack to outscore Oklahoma City by 21 points in the second frame (36-15), capping the 21-point swing by scoring the final 10 points of the first half to take an 11-point halftime lead... The 21-point second-quarter differential represented the most the Grizzlies have outscored an opponent in a second quarter in franchise history... Led by **Quincy Pondexter**, who scored 11 of his 13 points in the second quarter, the Grizzlies turned the game around on the strength of their bench, which scored 22 of the team's first 50 points... Memphis never trailed after Pondexter's third three-pointer snapped a 41-all tie with 3:45 remaining in the second quarter... Memphis did not commit a turnover until the 4:52 mark in the second quarter and finished with a season-low eight giveaways... The win marked the second consecutive season in which the Grizzlies defeated the two teams that made the previous NBA Finals... This season, Memphis topped the Miami Heat (Nov. 11) and Thunder (Nov. 14) after knocking off Miami (April 6, 2012) and Dallas (April 7, 2012) last season... There were only two lead changes in the game after Memphis never trailed in the previous game with Miami... Memphis took 21 more shots on goal than Oklahoma City (93-72)... **Rudy Gay** scored a season-high 28 points, including 18 in the second half to stave off Thunder comebacks... **Zach Randolph** finished with his seventh consecutive double-double (season-high 20 points, 11 rebounds), and **Marc Gasol** chipped in 14 points... **Jerryd Bayless** also tied a season high with 12 points in reserve, including nine in the final quarter... **Kevin Durant** had a season-high 34 points, 10 rebounds and five assists, while **Russell Westbrook** and **Serge Ibaka** each scored 17... Randolph and **Kendrick Perkins** were ejected with 2:05 remaining in the game... Marking the Grizzlies' first appearance on ESPN this season, the game drew an 8.2 rating in Memphis, the highest-rated NBA regular-season game in Memphis ever on ESPN.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #6 – MEMPHIS 104, MIAMI 86, Nov. 11 at FedExForum

Memphis, Tenn. – Led by a career-high seven triples from **Wayne Ellington**, the Memphis Grizzlies used a three-point barrage to vanquish the defending NBA Champion Miami Heat and record the best six-game start in franchise history... Ellington shot 8-of-13 from the field and 7-of-11 from deep en route to a career-high 25 points off the bench, leading the Grizzlies to a 41-26 advantage from the reserves... Memphis, which never trailed, broke open the game with a 14-1 run to end the first half and take a 15-point lead (56-41) into the locker room... The Grizzlies outscored the Heat 34-20 overall in the second quarter, including 16 points from Ellington, two shy of his previous career high... Memphis made six three-pointers in the second frame, tying a franchise record for three-point makes in a single quarter, and knocked down 14 shots total from long range, its most since hitting 15 on April 2, 2008 vs. New York... Ellington's seven threes were the most by a Grizzlies player since **Mike Miller** made eight on April 6, 2008, and his 25 points off the bench were the highest by a Grizzlies reserve since **Zach Randolph** scored 25 on March 16, 2012 vs. Toronto... Memphis won its fifth consecutive game and extended its franchise-record regular-season home winning streak to 14 games... **Rudy Gay** filled the box score with 21 points, eight rebounds, five assists, three steals and two blocks, while **Mike Conley** chipped in 18 points and nine assists... Randolph posted his sixth consecutive double-double to open the season with 18 points and 12 rebounds... **Chris Bosh** led Miami with 22 points, while **LeBron James** recorded a double-double with 20 points, 10 rebounds and six assists... **Dwyane Wade** scored only eight points... It marked the second consecutive matchup in which Memphis never trailed against Miami, as the Grizzlies moved to 3-1 against the Heat since the team acquired James and Bosh before the 2010-11 season... It also was the second time in the "Big Three" era that an opposing bench player outscored all three of James, Wade and Bosh (Milwaukee's **Chris Douglas-Roberts** on Jan. 7, 2011).

Grizzlies TV analyst **Brevin Knight** spent three seasons with the Bobcats, averaging 10.8 points, 8.3 assists, 2.8 rebounds and 1.97 steals in 30.9 minutes in 180 games (153 starts) from 2004-07... Knight ranked second in the NBA in assists per game in 2004-05 (9.0) and third in 2005-06 (8.8)... Grizzlies guard **Mike Conley** and Bobcats center **Byron Mullens** both played collegiately at Ohio State... Grizzlies forward **Rudy Gay**, Bobcats guard **Kemba Walker** and Bobcats guard **Ben Gordon** all played for the University of Connecticut... Bobcats forward **Hakim Warrick** was drafted by Memphis in the first round (19th overall) of the 2005 NBA Draft and played his first four NBA seasons for the Grizzlies, averaging 10.2 points and 4.3 rebounds in 307 games (82 starts).

2011-12 Game Stories:

REGULAR SEASON GAME #63 – MEMPHIS 85, CHARLOTTE 80, April 20 at Time Warner Cable Arena

Memphis, Tenn. – The Memphis Grizzlies came alive in the fourth quarter, closing out their 2011-12 road slate with a victory and sending the Charlotte Bobcats to a franchise-record 19th consecutive loss... Though the Bobcats entered the game with seven wins on the season, they led the Grizzlies by as many as 10 in the third quarter... However, Memphis started the fourth quarter with a 22-6 run to turn an eight-point deficit into a eight-point lead (79-71) with 4:53 remaining in the game... Memphis scored 10 unanswered at the end of the run, starting with **Mike Conley's** driving layup that tied the game at 71 and two successive dunks by former Bobcat **Dante Cunningham**... Memphis would outscore Charlotte 28-15 in the fourth quarter to hand the Bobcats a 12th-straight home loss... Conley finished with 20 points for the second-straight game to lead the Grizzlies, while Cunningham scored seven of his nine points in the final frame... The only other player to reach double figures for Memphis was **Zach Randolph**, who scored 14 points off the bench and helped the Grizzlies reserves outscore their Bobcats counterparts 42-8... Charlotte's **Gerald Henderson** scored a career-high tying 32 points, while **Byron Mullens** recorded a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds)... Charlotte went on 17-0 and 9-0 runs in the first half... The Grizzlies scored 27 points off 22 Bobcats turnovers... Memphis finished its road schedule with a .455 winning percentage, the fourth-highest in a single season in franchise history.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #21 – MEMPHIS 100, DENVER 97 (OT), Jan. 31 at FedExForum

Memphis, Tenn. – The Memphis Grizzlies found their shooting touch, their grit and their grind in the fourth quarter against the Denver Nuggets, rallying to send the game into overtime and snap a four-game losing streak... After shooting .306 over the first three quarters of the game, Memphis made 11 of its 16 field goal attempts (.688), including 3-of-5 from three-point range, to storm back from 11 down in the fourth and force overtime... The Grizzlies scored the final seven points in OT and with **O.J. Mayo's** three-pointer with 35.1 seconds remaining, took their first lead (98-97) since the first quarter... **Rudy Gay** bounced back with 20 points, a career-high tying 13 rebounds, a season-high tying five assists and two blocks, while **Marc Gasol** also tallied 20 points and 13 boards in a season-high 50 minutes... Mayo scored 14 of his 18 points in the fourth quarter and overtime, while **Tony Allen** made all four of his fourth-quarter field goal attempts en route to 17 points and a career-high tying four blocks... The Nuggets, who had their five-game road winning streak snapped, were led from the bench by **Al Harrington's** 23 points and 10 rebounds and **Andre Miller's** 20 points and six assists.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #31 – MEMPHIS 103, DENVER 102, Feb. 17 at FedExForum

Memphis, Tenn. – **Dante Cunningham's** last-second tip-in saved the day for the Memphis Grizzlies, who climbed to sixth-place in the Western Conference, won their third consecutive game and thwarted a furious second-half comeback by the Denver Nuggets... Cunningham's game-winning putback came with 0.2 seconds left in the game, when he earned position from **Kenneth Faried** to tip in a missed baseline jumper by **Rudy Gay**... It was Memphis' only offensive rebound during a fourth quarter that saw the Nuggets outboard the Grizzlies 12-4 in mounting their second-half rally... After Memphis outscored Denver 34-15 in the first quarter and led by as many as 23 points in the third quarter (66-43), **Corey Brewer** would spark the Nuggets by scoring 18 of his season-high 26 points in the third quarter alone, including three treys in a 60-second span... Denver would cut Memphis' led down to 10 at the end of the third and then record the first of the game's eight lead changes with 4:34 remaining in the fourth off a putback by Brewer to make the score 91-90... Neither team would lead by more than two points for the remainder of the game, as Brewer would again crash the boards to give the Nuggets a one-point lead (102-101) with 24.6 seconds left to set up Cunningham's heroics in the Grizzlies' final possession... Memphis upended Denver down the stretch for a second time this season, following the team's Jan. 31 overtime victory over the Nuggets at FedExForum... **Rudy Gay** led Memphis with 20 points... **Marc Gasol** posted 16 points, 14 rebounds, a season-high eight assists and three blocks... **Mike Conley** added 16 points, seven assists and a season-high tying five steals... **Marreese Speights** recorded a second consecutive double-double with 12 points and 10 boards... **O.J. Mayo** scored 17 off the bench... Brewer scored all of his 26 points in the second half and made five of his six three-point attempts... **Kenneth Faried** scored a career-high 18 points to go with his career-best tying 10 rebounds for his first career double-double.

REGULAR SEASON GAME #40 – MEMPHIS 94, DENVER 91, March 11 at Pepsi Center

Memphis, Tenn. – **O.J. Mayo** (22 points, eight assists, three steals) came up huge off the bench, as the Memphis Grizzlies finished their first-ever season series sweep over the Denver Nuggets and exited the Pepsi Center winners for the first time since Nov. 28, 2006... Mayo scored six of the Grizzlies' final eight points, including a clutch three-pointer from the top of the key that put Memphis up five (94-89) with 57.0 seconds remaining, as the reserves combined for 49 of the Grizzlies' 94 points... Denver's **Corey Brewer** and **Nene** would each split pairs of free throws to cut Memphis' lead to two, but **Andre Miller** fumbled away the Nuggets' final possession with 2.9 seconds left, the last of the Nuggets' 24 turnovers, to seal the win for the Grizzlies... **Dante Cunningham** added a season-high tying 12 points and a season-best three blocks, while **Quincy Pondexter** scored nine... **Mike Conley** had 13 points, seven assists and two steals, extending his career-high and franchise-record multiple-steal streak up to 11 games, the longest in the NBA this season... The Grizzlies shot .507 from the field to offset the Nuggets' 47-33 rebounding edge and remain undefeated this season (9-0) when hitting the 50 percent mark... Denver opened the second half by missing nine of its first 10 shots and committing eight turnovers... Memphis would score 26 points off Denver's 24 miscues on the night... The Grizzlies defeated the Nuggets in Denver for just the fourth time and the second inside the Pepsi Center... **Corey Brewer**, **Al Harrington** and **Nene** all scored 15 points to lead the Nuggets.

- ***The Memphis Grizzlies sit atop the NBA standings and own the league's best record (7-1) for the first time in team history...*** Memphis has won seven-in-a-row, including three consecutive wins over the 2012 NBA Champion Miami Heat (Nov. 11), 2012 Western Conference Champion Oklahoma City Thunder (Nov. 14) and the New York Knicks (Nov. 16), who were the last unbeaten team in the league this season before a loss to Memphis.
- With a win tonight, Memphis will tie the franchise record for consecutive victories (8), which was established from Jan. 11-25, 2004... The Grizzlies' seven-game winning streak is their longest since winning seven-in-a-row from Jan. 12-23, 2012.
- ***Memphis owns the highest point differential (+9.2) in the Western Conference and second-highest in the NBA behind tonight's opponent, the New York Knicks.***
- The Grizzlies have extended their franchise-record regular season home winning streak to **15** games dating back to March 18, 2012 vs. Washington... Memphis' last regular season home loss came in overtime on March 16, 2012 vs. Toronto... The Grizzlies' most recent regular season home loss in regulation came on Feb. 12, 2012 vs. Utah... The streak eclipses the former 11-game record that originally was set from Dec. 18, 2009-Jan. 25, 2010.
- ***The Grizzlies have forced at least 10 turnovers in 112 consecutive games, the longest active streak in the NBA, more than twice the games of the second-longest active streak (Miami, 52).***
- Memphis' bench is keeping close with opponents this season, scoring **28.3** points to opponents' **29.0** points... ***According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time the Grizzlies' reserves outscored the opposition over the course of a season was the 2006-07 season (35.1 to 30.8).***
- The Grizzlies rank **fifth** in the NBA in three-point field goal percentage (**.386**) this season after ranking in the bottom third of the league in all of the previous five seasons (.343 from 2007-08 to 2011-12).
- Memphis' win over Oklahoma City marked the second consecutive season in which the Grizzlies defeated the two teams that made the previous NBA Finals in back-to-back games... This season, Memphis topped the Miami Heat (Nov. 11) and Thunder (Nov. 14) after knocking off Miami (April 6, 2012) and Dallas (April 7, 2012) last season.
- There were only two lead changes in the Nov. 14 win over the Thunder after Memphis never trailed in the previous game on Nov. 11 vs. Miami.
- ***Memphis' Nov. 14 victory at Oklahoma City on drew an 8.2 rating in Memphis, the highest-rated NBA regular-season game in Memphis ever on ESPN.***
- The Grizzlies outscored the Thunder 36-15 in the second quarter in their road win on Nov. 14... The 21-point second-quarter differential represented the most the Grizzlies have outscored an opponent in a second quarter in franchise history... The previous record was 20 points, set twice by the team, last on April 4, 2009 at Milwaukee...
- Led by **Wayne Ellington's** seven treys, the Grizzlies drained 14 three-pointers (on 24 attempts) in their win on Nov. 11 vs. Miami, the most the team has made in a single game since knocking down 15 on April 2, 2008 vs. New York.
- Memphis earned its first home-opening win since Oct. 31, 2008 vs. Orlando and now stands at 4-14 all-time in home openers.
- The Grizzlies are **6-0** this season when reaching 100 points (17-3 in 2011-12, with two of the three losses coming in overtime).
- Memphis is also **1-0** this season when shooting at least .500 from the field after going undefeated (13-0) when shooting at that rate last season... The Grizzlies have won their last **22** games when shooting above .500 dating back to a victory on March 14, 2011 vs. LA Clippers.
- Last season, the Grizzlies clinched the fourth seed in the Western Conference Playoffs, their highest seed ever, and hosted a playoff series for the first time in team history.
- The 2011-12 Grizzlies set a franchise record for winning percentage (.621), topping the previous record from the 2003-04 season (.610)... Memphis also won 26 of its 33 home games (.788), the fifth-highest mark in the NBA and the best in franchise history (.756 in 2003-04).
- Memphis finished second in the Southwest Division last season, earning their highest end-of-season division rank.
- Since he was tabbed as head coach in January 2009, **Lionel Hollins** has improved the team's regular season record every season.
- Under **Lionel Hollins**, Memphis has become one of the most feared defensive units in the league... The Grizzlies topped the NBA in steals (9.6) and forced turnovers (17.1) last season after doing so the year before, becoming the first team to lead the league in both steals per game and forced turnovers per game for consecutive seasons was the 1995-96 and 1996-97 Seattle SuperSonics.

Last season, the Grizzlies upended the Heat and the Dallas Mavericks on consecutive nights (April 6-7, 2012)... There were only two lead changes in the victory over Oklahoma City, while Memphis never trailed against the 2012 NBA Champion Miami Heat.

From the Elias Sports Bureau: The Grizzlies, who have played only seven games this season, have already beaten both the Heat and the Thunder... Memphis is the first team in six years to beat both teams that played in the previous season's NBA Finals within the first seven games of the season... The 2006-07 Rockets beat the Mavericks in their second game of that season and the Heat in their seventh game.

BEARY IMPRESSIVE

Following a season-opening loss on Oct. 31 at LA Clippers, the Memphis Grizzlies have won **seven** straight to get off to the best start in franchise history... - The franchise's all-time winningest head coach.
- Has guided Memphis to a better regular season winning percentage each season since being named head coach on Jan. 25, 2009, culminating with a franchise-record mark of .621 during the 2011-12 season.
- Memphis has enjoyed arguably its greatest success as a franchise since Hollins' hire, posting a **147-130** regular season record (.531) in the last four-plus seasons after going 55-152 (.266) in the two-and-a-half seasons prior... The Grizzlies have also won 10 playoff games over that time, having never won a postseason game before hiring Hollins.

Since **Lionel Hollins** was hired as the 11th head coach in team history on Jan. 25, 2009, he has helped to define the Grizzlies as a team that is distinctly "Memphis" – tough, resilient, gritty and successful.

An original member of the Vancouver Grizzlies as an assistant coach in 1995, Hollins has taken the franchise to new heights in less than four full seasons, guiding Memphis to a 13-game run through the 2011 NBA Playoffs that included a first-round upset over the top-seeded San Antonio Spurs and a dramatic seven-game series with the Oklahoma City Thunder in the Western Conference Semifinals. Hollins and the Grizzlies gave the city of Memphis its first brush with NBA Playoff success by winning the first seven postseason games in team history.

The winningest head coach in franchise history, Hollins led Memphis to a franchise-record regular season winning percentage (.621) last season, earning the Grizzlies a second-place finish in the Southwest Division and the fourth seed in the Western Conference Playoffs, both club bests.

Hollins has helped to establish a team identity and culture within the organization, transforming what was a young, inexperienced roster into one of the most tenacious and cohesive units in the NBA, leading the league in steals and forced turnovers in each of the past two seasons. Memphis also paces the league in points in the paint per game (49.6) since the start of the 2009-10 season.

The Grizzlies have steadily improved since Hollins' hiring, posting a 140-129 record (.520) after going 55-152 (.266) in the two-and-a-half seasons prior. In Hollins' first full season as head coach, during which he won the Western Conference Coach of the Month Award (December 2009), the Grizzlies posted a 40-42 record (.488), the second-best improvement in the NBA in 2009-10 (16 wins), while setting a club record for scoring (102.5 points) and establishing the longest home (11, Dec. 18, 2009-Jan. 25, 2010) and road winning streaks (7, Feb. 17-March 10, 2010) in franchise history.

The 22-year NBA coaching veteran was an original member of the Vancouver franchise and was a staple on the coaching sidelines for 10 of its first 12 seasons (1995-00, 2002-07). Hollins also served as the club's interim head coach on two separate occasions. Hollins guided Vancouver to an 18-42 finish (.300) in 1999-00, replacing **Brian Hill** after the team started the season 4-18 (.182), and again took over for four games in 2004-05 following the resignation of Hall of Famer **Hubie Brown**. Hollins owns an overall career coaching record of 158-175 (.474), including two stints as Grizzlies interim head coach.

Prior to joining the Grizzlies, the Arizona State graduate spent seven years with the Phoenix Suns (1988-95) as an assistant coach under **Cotton Fitzsimmons** and later **Paul Westphal**. During that time, Phoenix compiled an overall record of 394-180 (.686) and never won fewer than 53 games in a single season. The Suns won a franchise-record 62 games in the 1992-93 season and represented the Western Conference in the 1993 NBA Finals against the Chicago Bulls. Hollins returned to the sidelines in 2008 as an assistant under Milwaukee Bucks Head Coach **Scott Skiles**.

The Las Vegas native has honed his straightforward approach by serving under three NBA Coaches of the Year, including Brown (1977, 2005), Fitzsimmons (1978, 1989) and Fratello (1986) and was on the coaching staff when Brown and Fitzsimmons were honored with the award a second time. During his 10-year playing career (1975-85) in the NBA, Hollins was led by several notable head coaches, including the NBA's all-time coaching wins leader and Hall of Famer **Lenny Wilkens**, Hall of Famers **Billy Cunningham**, **Chuck Daly** and **Jack Ramsay**, as well as **Bill Fitch** and **Paul Silas**.

Selected sixth overall in the first round of the 1975 NBA Draft by the Portland Trail Blazers, Hollins earned a spot on the 1976 All-Rookie First Team and won an NBA Championship as a starter for the Trail Blazers in 1977. A year later, he was an NBA All-Star while also being named to the NBA's All-Defensive First Team. Hollins averaged 11.6 points, 4.5 assists and 1.56 steals over 673 career games with the Trail Blazers, Philadelphia 76ers, San Diego Clippers, Detroit Pistons and Houston Rockets.

Hollins has been inducted into the Halls of Fame of the NCAA, Arizona State University, Nevada High School Basketball, Southern Nevada Sports and the Pac-10. In addition, he has been named one of the Top 100 athletes of Nevada and one of the top 150 athletes of Arizona. His No. 14 jersey is retired by the Trail Blazers and his No. 33 jersey was raised to the rafters by Arizona State on Feb. 17, 2011.

He also is one of three NBA coaches, along with **Doc Rivers** and **Rick Carlisle**, on the new NBA competition committee, which recommends changes to playing rules or any other competition-related matters to the Board of Governors for its consideration and vote.

Hollins, who lives in Memphis, has been extremely active in the community. He serves on the Board of Directors for the Grizzlies Foundation and regularly leads Community Investment programs. In conjunction with Lionel Hollins Charities, he established the annual Bowling for Backpacks event in 2003, which has raised thousands of dollars to purchase school supplies and uniforms for underprivileged youth; and established the annual Bike Buddies event in 2010, in which hundreds of bicycles with helmets and locks have been provided for area children in need during the Christmas holiday, following an afternoon of reading, face painting and games. In addition, he hosts an annual Role Models Dinner, which includes a fine dining experience and a connection with mentors that volunteer for one year at their school.
