TEAM NOTES

Top players:

Park Ji-Sung is the most successful player in the country's history and will wear the armband during the World Cup. On the right win, he will be counted on to me more of an attacking threat than he is at Manchester United.

Ki Sung-Yong is a highly skilled central midfielder who gives Korea a playmaker that could be the difference between the early exit of 2006 and advancing to the second round.

Lee Young-Pyo is the team's most capped outfield player and provides an attacking dimension from the left back position. Now 33-years-old, Lee can still provide Korea a bit of quality on the ball.

Keys to success:

While you hear so much about a team's spine, South Korea has questions down theirs. The Tigers of Asia, having many of their talents allocated to the wide positions, will have to rely on organization in lieu of talent through the middle of the team.

Outlook:

In a touch Group B, South Korea should be confident. If they take care of business against Nigeria and Greece - a reasonable expectation for them - the Koreans will be back in the second round. With Group B paired opposite Group A in the Round of 16, Korea will not face an insurmountable second round obstacle.
