TEAM NOTES

Top players:

The veteran, central midfield pairing of captain **Giorgios Karagounis** and fellow Panathinaikos teammate **Kostas Katsouranis** enable **Otto Rehhagel** to be very flexible with his formation. Whether the formation is five at the back or three, three forwards or one, his Pana pairing is at its heart.

Theofanis Gekas led UEFA qualifying with 10 goals, including four against Latvia toward the end of qualifying. He will work in front of **Georgios Samaras**, playing wide left as one of the Greek's most creative players.

Sotirios Kyrgiakos is the most recognized name on the team sheet by virtue of his early season move to Liverpool. He is part of a back line which, though known for being stalwart, gave up a goal per game in UEFA's weak group 2.

Keys to success:

Is it enough to be dogged and organized? Probably not, so the key to Greek success will be combining that approach with timely scoring, particularly Gekas. Differences in opinion on the team's potential likely center on this question: Was Gekas' qualifying form replicable?

Outlook:

Second place is within reach, but so is fourth. You can see the Greeks giving sometimes tactic-less Argentina fits, but you can see the disciplined Koreans picking them apart. Many positive prognostications about Greece implicitly refer to 2004, but the 2006 qualifying cycle and 2008 European Championships tell us 2004 is too long ago. Greece is a contender, not a favorite, to get out of Group B.
